



A gold ring set with a Roman carnelian intaglio. Sol Invictus.

Circa: 2nd - 3rd century A.D.

Roman, 2nd - 3rd century A.D. on an modern gold ring.

The god is standing, with the radiated head, the right hand raised in the typical pose of the Sol Invictus; with his left hand he holds the solar whip and a drapery. In the field, a greek inscription. Partially burnt surface of the stone.

Helios, in Greek religion, the sun god. He drove a chariot daily from East to West across the sky.
